



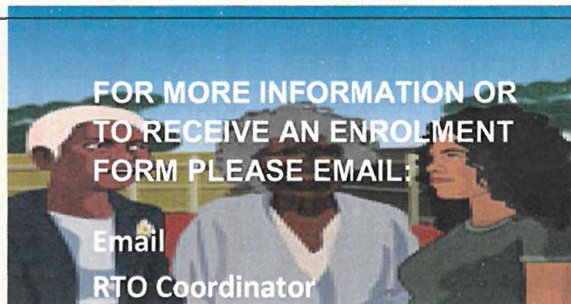
**Would like to get a job as Aboriginal health worker / a qualification?**

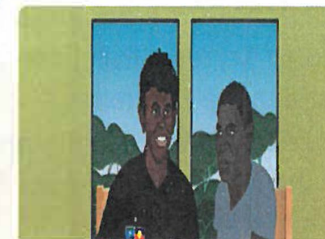
